Dear Minority Leader Schumer and Ranking Member Warren:

We, the undersigned investor, worker, consumer, civil rights, and public interest organizations, write to urge you to advocate for qualified nominees to serve in the minority seats on the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) as soon as possible.

The SEC is the lead regulator of the U.S. securities markets with decisions made by the Commission impacting investments for workers, pension funds, and families saving for retirement. The impact is felt in household economic security and opportunity, as well as the stability and health of the U.S. economy.

We urge you to propose and fight to confirm dedicated and qualified public servants to the Commission. It is the prerogative of Democratic leadership - supported by statute and by longstanding bipartisan practice - to move forward candidates who will robustly advance the public interest with regard to the agency's crucial mission. Nominees must recognize the critical role they play in protecting investors, including retail investors and pension fund beneficiaries, from fraud and abuse by powerful insiders, which includes promoting and safeguarding the availability of information that investors, pension funds, and working people need to make investment decisions that benefit themselves and their families. Nominees must also be committed to robust and transparent public markets, and to expanding rather than reducing the reach of fundamental investor protections, transparency, and rules of fair dealing.

It is imperative that the Senate consider and confirm qualified, public interest oriented leaders to serve on the SEC who will prioritize investor protections and shareholder rights and use their voice on the Commission to advocate for fair oversight of the capital markets. The absence of such leadership on the Commission would risk eroding a vital regulator's ability to fairly and effectively oversee the securities market, putting individual and institutional investors, and our nation's economic health at grave risk.

We respectfully urge you to defend investor protections and fair rules of the road and move swiftly to advance candidates that are committed to protecting investors, workers, and consumers in the coming weeks.
